Big Picture

- Water is critical to all life, and is recognized by the United Nations as a universal human right, and – like the air we breathe - part of our shared `commons'. Water taking here in the Town of Erin has an impact locally and globally.

Local Picture

- Bottled water is unnecessary except in emergency situations, and meeting this need has traditionally been fulfilled by groups such as the Red Cross and other relief organizations.
- The use of bottled water undermines municipal water infrastructure.
- Water from Hillsburgh leaves our watershed, and is sold in places as far away as New York, Texas, and Florida, and across Canada.
- Increased truck traffic causes pollution and wear and tear on local roads.
- We are representing growing numbers of citizens and groups increasing daily

 who would like our Council to say no to Nestlé's levy, and who themselves
 have said no to using plastic water bottles.
- We would like to hear from Council why there is such a hurry to make this decision? There are many more who want to be heard.

Be it resolved that the Town of Erin Council:

- Votes NO to the voluntary levy, or
- At the very least, defers the decision until other concerned citizens and groups have had an opportunity to be heard on this critical issue.
