General (CTO):

- Third quarter was busy in the Training Division. July's focus was Auto Extrication, we trained at the stations covering size up, developing IAP, and command. Crews were met with many scenarios from underrides, vehicles on their sides and vehicles on their roof. Scene safety, vehicle stabilization repeated at every scenario
- Joint training in July had our own Firefighter Dave Gingrich, a Peel Paramedic review patient assessment and care. Feedback was fantastic and I look forward to using Dave and his skills again.
- In August we familiarized ourselves with the location and hookup procedures of all the cisterns and reservoirs in both stations run areas.
- In September we acquired a 2 ½ story house that served as a training structure to practice size up, developing an IAP and command. We stretched lines, flowed water, practiced search and rescue and many RIT drills. Using fake smoke we trained as realistically as possible. We have had great feedback from both the Officers and the Firefighters.

FIRE PREVENTION

Fire Inspections:

The Chief Fire Prevention Officer completed the mandatory Fire Inspections and witnessed a timed fire drill at the vulnerable occupancies within the town. No issues or concerns were noted, all are compliant.

Conducted numerous Fires Safety Plan reviews and returns as well as conducting annual reviews of plans.
